Citation and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Disabled Persons (1989 Act) (Commencement No. 1) Order (Northern Ireland) 1989.
- (2) In this Order "the Act" means the Disabled Persons (Northern Ireland) Act 1989.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order brings into operation on 7th December 1989 sections 9, 10, 11 (except paragraph (4)) and 12 of the Disabled Persons (Northern Ireland) Act 1989. Section 9 requires that appropriate organisations of disabled people should be consulted before appointments or co-options to certain bodies are made. Section 10 provides for annual reports to be laid before the Northern Ireland Assembly by the Department of Health and Social Services giving certain information in relation to persons suffering from mental disorder. Section 11 (except paragraph (4)) defines expressions used in the Act and describes the procedural requirements for regulations and orders under the Act. Section 12 provides for the short title, commencement and extent of the Act.
